Salkehatchie Summer Service – Newberry Camp Rules

- No alcohol or drugs are allowed at camp, are to be consumed while at camp, or during the camp week. Possession or consumption of any such items will constitute immediate dismissal from the camp.
- This is a tobacco free camp. No smoking or vaping of any kind is permitted.
- **No one, including adults** shall leave the camp after we have come in for the evening unless cleared with a director. Safe Sanctuary rules apply to all travel.
- **Lights out is at 11PM.** We are here to have fun, but this is a work camp and the hours between 11PM and 6AM are for rest. Everyone should be in their own sleeping area by 10:45PM. Tired workers create hazardous working conditions. Please do not to leave the premises of your respective church after lights out.
- Food and supplies from the dining room must not be taken into the sleeping areas. Food items attract bugs. Do not keep snacks in your room. Food items must be consumed in the dining area or outside.
- Safe Sanctuary policies are in effect at all times for our camp and must be followed as defined by the conference and the Salkehatchie Summer Service Safe Sanctuary Policy.
- Do not lock or block any of the outside doors or any doors in your rooms. Fire exits must be kept clear and free from obstruction at all times.
- Males are not allowed down the halls of or in the female quarters at any time during the week. Females are not allowed down the halls of in the male quarters at any time during the week.
- The elevator and the office areas of the church are off limits.
- All visits to camp by anyone who is not a paid participant or are not associated
 with a group scheduled to provide meals to the camp, must be cleared through
 the directors <u>prior</u> to the visit. We realize that it is impossible for all visits from
 non-paid participants to the camp to be planned, but please inform the directors
 ahead of time if you are expecting company.

Salkehatchie Summer Service – Newberry Camp Rules

- Guests must visit in the "commons area" of the Central Family Life Center. (Participants are not allowed to meet visitors outside, in the parking lot, etc.)
- In the evenings while at Central, do not leave the city block on which the church is located. (The gas station is not on that block.)
- Please park in the gravel lot at the corner of College and Johnstone Streets.

A Note Regarding Cell Phone Use ...

Technology, especially cell phones, have become part of our daily lives and must be used in a responsible and respectful manner while at camp.

- Devices are the sole responsibility of the owner.
- Devices <u>are not</u> allowed out on the work site, during mealtimes, or nightly programs. Distractions create dangerous working conditions.
- Adult leaders <u>are permitted</u> to have their cell phones on site.
- If anyone is "glued" to a device during camp, it will be confiscated and locked up after one warning.
- No cell phones are allowed in the beds after lights out. We need all the rest we can get to assure safety on our work sites.
- Please ensure devices are set to silent or vibrate at appropriate times.
- Please consider that a limited number of electrical outlets are available, so charging these devices may be a problem.
